5a. Quotes for The Lands at Hillside Farms Dam Removal Project

Longmore provided a list of the four quotes received for the dam removal project. The lowest was from Mitchell Knorr Contracting for \$193,184, and the company was verified through DEP's contractor responsibility program. **Motion by Hanish, seconded by Herbert to authorize Longmore to contract with Mitchell Knorr Contracting, in the amount of \$193,184, for the dam removal project at The Lands of Hillside Farms. 5b. PACD Executive Council Voting Matters

The 2024 Spring PACD Region Meetings Summary was provided, and a discussion was held on the three resolutions that will be considered at the upcoming PACD Executive Council meeting on July 17, 2024. The consensus of the board was to vote in favor of actions 1 and 2, and to abstain from voting on action 3.

5c. State Program Funding Requests for Fiscal Year 2024/2025

Per the approved 2024 District Budget, Longmore prepared a request for Conservation District Fund Allocation Program (CDFAP) funding. If approved, the proposed state budget would provide cost shares of \$30,000 for the Manager, \$20,000 for an E&S technician, and \$20,000 for an ACT technician. Also, each year an application is submitted for Watershed Specialist funding under a 5-year grant agreement with DEP. The current agreement provides \$50,250 per year, and DEP is offering a new optional "mini grant" for up to \$5,000 for education and outreach initiatives.

**Motion by Moyer, seconded by Hanish to approve the request for FY24/25 state funding as described. The motion carried unanimously.

5d. New Copier Purchase

Longmore reported issues with the current copier. Due to its age, parts are no longer available for repairs. He obtained quotes for a new Canon Image Runner Model C3935I from Golden Business Machines for \$8,468 and Topp Business Solutions for \$7,525, both with maintenance agreements.

**Motion by Burger, seconded by Hanish to authorize the purchase of a Canon C3935I with a maintenance agreement from Topp Business Solutions for \$7,525 under the PA COSTARS program. The motion carried unanimously.

5e. Employee Step Increase Acknowledgment

Wilkes acknowledged that Bednarczyk has successfully achieved a step increase within the district's Employee Pay Schedule.

5f. Re-scheduling of July Board Meeting

Wilkes recommended changing the time for the July 18th meeting to 6:00 PM because Longmore, Hanish, and Herbert will be in State College attending the PACD/SCC Joint Annual Conference and will not be back in time for a noon meeting.

**Motion by Herbert, seconded by Hanish to change the time for the July 18, 2024 board meeting from noon to 6:00 PM. The motion carried unanimously.
